The following materials are intended for the use of Spokane Arts and the SAGA grantees, and will help you get the recognition your work deserves. Here are some suggested ways to announce your SAGA:

AWARD LANGUAGE FOR PRINT MATERIALS

Please acknowledge your grant in print materials using the following language:

The {title of project} has been made possible in part by a SAGA grant from the Spokane Arts Fund.

PRESS RELEASES

Send out a press release announcing the grant award.

Send out press releases preceding and following your program's events.

Invite local media, donors, and elected officials and provide photo opportunities when appropriate.

IN-HOUSE PUBLICATIONS

Feature the grant award in any newsletters, donor update letters, or notifications your organization shares with its constituents.

LOGOS
